The provisions of a bill signed by Governor Oison effective Sept. 19, make this change mandatory. The new name, it was feit by the Commission members, will give the public a more comprehensive picture of the work the Commission was intended to accomplish.

Members of the Commission have revised their rule regarding payment of contributions to the unemployment fund. Hereafter, all contributions will be fielinquent 20 days after the due date. The provisions of a bill signe

The Commission also adopted a presedure which will permit
