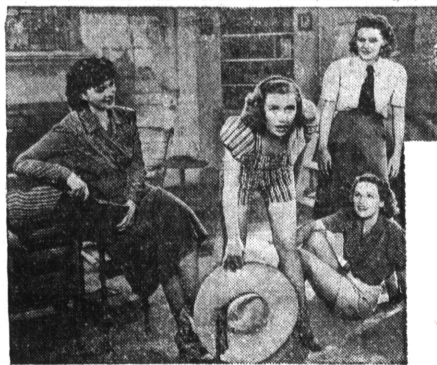

### Protect Your Children!

Tell Them To Use These Guarded Crossings On Way To School

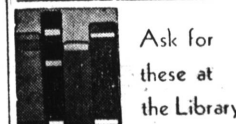
Announcement of the hours and intersections where crossing guards will be placed for the protection of children going to and returning from school was made today by A. H. Tryon, superintendent of the Los Angeles Crossing Guard Department, under the direction of the sheriff's office.

"We urge mothers to co-operate with the local chief of police and school teachers in an effort to have children use these protected intersections," Superintendent Tryon stated to The Herald this week. "If they do this, we shall be able to maintain our record of only one child killed in seven years in the entire Los Angeles county where a crossing guard is present," he added.

Crossing guards for this area will be placed at the intersections

listed in the accompanying chart beginning with the first day of school, Sept. 11. All guards are carefully chosen and fingerprinted. Supt. Tryon states, "Every guard is thoroughly investigated before he is engaged and only married men are used, over 99 percent of whom have children of their own," he added.

"Chancey Wright will be in charge of the work in this area, and both he and myself, as well as all other members of the crossing guard staff are anxious to co-operate with P. T. A. and other organizations." Superintendent Tryon emphasized.



ALL IN THE DAYS WORK by Ida Tarbell: Miss Tarbell began her writing career in 1880 and has occupied a unique place in the field of American letters. The volume is full of anecdote and reminiscences of her friends and associates in literary and public life, Lincoln Steffens, Ray Stannard Baker, S. S. McClure, Peter Dunne, Cleveland, Roosevelt and Wilson.

REACHING FOR THE STARS by Nora Walb: Has been the nationwide favorite in non fiction. Surely because in it burns that flame of hope that Hitler is not all Germany, and that the Germany that is not Hitler will survive.

Nora Walb was born a Quaker in Pennsylvania, lived in China many years and in 1934 went with her English husband to live in Germany. There she stayed for four years. Her book is composed of her experiences and observations and since her interest lies in the reaction of all kinds of people to the power of official Germany yields it is packed with human interest. She is sincerely motivated to see the picture without prejudice and without bias. To every intelligent person who wants to know what the German people are thinking while they are acting according to rule we recommend "Reaching for the Stars."
