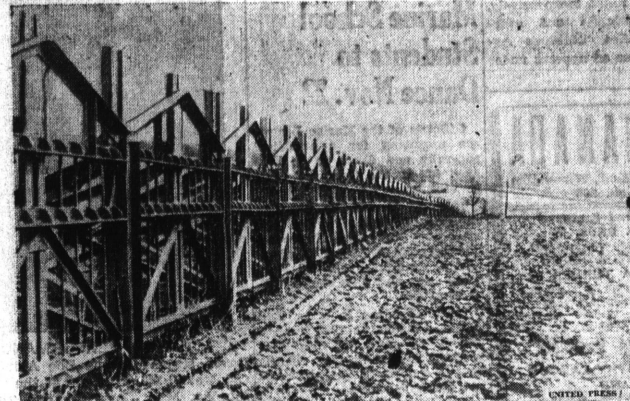

### Port Defense Said Good by General

Not that any fears were  
chilling the spines of resi-  
dents in this area—but it is  
comforting to learn that San  
Pedro's harbor defenses are  
adequate for their purpose of  
keeping enemy ships from en-  
tering and using the port as  
a base.

Nevertheless, new defenses  
for the Pacific coast are now  
being prepared, according to  
Maj. Gen. Julian L. Schley,  
chief of army engineers, who  
said this week that the coast  
defense plans are being drafted  
by the engineering corps  
and will be started shortly.

Gen. Schley, who visited in  
the harbor area Monday, de-  
clined to give details of lo-  
cation for the new defenses  
but said that the government  
is spending some \$60,000,000  
on similar safeguards  
throughout the country. Fol-  
lowing a tour of the harbor  
in company with Los Angeles  
area engineers, he described  
the defenses as "excellent"  
and denied rumors that arm-  
ament at the port is antiquated.

have only the latest, streamlined  
equipment" to "keep pace with  
its modern development." Mayor  
Toison, replying to Isen on this  
point later said: "It's a funny  
thing, but a representative of  
the American La France fire  
truck company made almost the  
same statement you made, Mr.  
Isen, about that."

Isen denied that the contro-  
versy was aroused, as Manager  
Hobgood of the Mack company  
suggested in his reply to the  
council on the 14 questions, by  
competing fire truck firms. The  
attorney continued by saying two  
things "bother me about the fire  
department." These were: that  
the doors to the fire department  
are now kept closed and "I'm  
told that at the last fire prac-  
tice, the truck's valve stuck and  
it took five minutes to get  
water thru it."

John Stroh, head of the de-  
partment, replied to these com-  
ments, stating that the doors  
were closed in order that fire-  
men could work on putting  
equipment on the Ford truck  
without interruption by visitors  
and will be open again as usual  
when that job is done; and that  
only a small valve, to which a  
garden hose is attached, stuck  
when the truck was used on a  
minor blaze.
