Noted Artist Draws Yule Seal Design

The 1939 Christmas Seal, depicting the angel of peace and designed by Rockwell Kent, one of America's foremost living artists, was previewed by the Board of the Combined Christmas Seal Fund, which is conducting for the first time this year a joint mail sale for the Los Angeles County Tuberculosis and Health Association and the Los Angeles Tuberculosis and Health Association. Plans for the annual mail sale to begin December 1st, were approved.

Camp Fire Girls through the cooperation of Miss Beattie D. Stoddard, a member of the Board of Directors of the Los Angeles County Tuberculosis and Health Association, are assisting in folding 50,000,000 Christmas Seals, to be sent to 275,000 residents of Los Angeles County, including those of Torrance.

"Each Christmas Seal is a means of raising money for the prevention of tuberculosis and through their use on holiday letters and packages serve as reminders that the conquering of this disease is the problem of every thinking man and woman," Miss Stoddard explained.
