"Soul and Body" is the subject of the Lesson-Sermon on Sunday in all Churches of Christ, Scientist. The Golden Text is from 1 Corinthians: "What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own?"

The Lesson-Sermon includes also these passages from Matthew: "And when Jesus departed thence, two blind men followed him, crying, and saying, Thou son of David, have mercy on us." - and Jesus saith unto them, Believe ye that I am able to do this? They said unto him, Yea, Lord. Then touched he their eyes, saying, According to your faith be it unto you. And their eyes were opened. These selections from Mark are also presented: "And they bring unto him one that was deaf, and had an impediment in his speech; ... And looking up to heaven, he sighed, and saith unto him, Ephphatha, that is, Be opened. And straightway his ears were opened, and the string of his tongue was loosed, and he spake plain."

Among the passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy, are the statements: "There is more Christianity in seeing and hearing spiritually than materially. ... The apprehension of this gave sight to the blind and hearing to the deaf centuries ago, and it will repeat the wonder."

Launching the local campaign to secure signatures for a state-wide initiative prohibition measure, Miss Norma C. Brown, national temperance speaker will address a rally of dries at the Woman's club house 1422 Engracia avenue, Friday, Nov. 17 at 7:30 o'clock. Rev. Harry G. Banks will preside.

The petition, which is being circulated by California Dries, Inc., with state offices at Los Angeles, is designed to place the proposition on the ballot for the general election in November, 1940. California Dries, Inc. has been organized to coordinate the activities of all temperance advocates in this direction.

Miss Brown, who was formerly with the Flying Squadron, in nearly twenty years of lecturing has earned a reputation as a national authority on the liquor question. Her subject will be "Repeal Has Failed, What Next?"

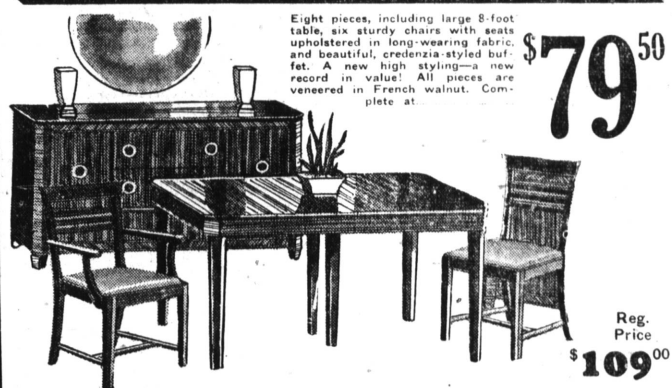

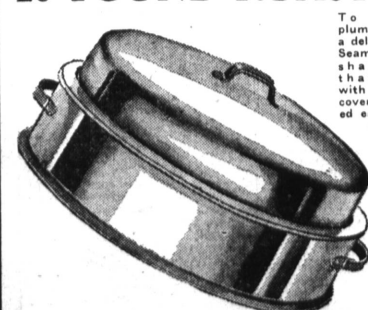
