upon instructions from the board of supervisors, on motion of Supervisor Oscar Haug.

Amount of the reassessment against the property owners in the district is to be \$34,120, while the county is to contribute \$34,120 to aid in the refunding. The refunding bonds are to be payable in 10 equal annual installments.

Tax revenues accruing to the city of Los Angeles, the county, the flood control district and the Los Angeles city school district will approximate \$50,000, it was estimated.

Many property owners are planning to improve their vacant holdings as soon as the refunding is completed, with the aid of federally-insured loans, according to information gathered by S. E. Elliott, special assessment investigators for the county.
