

# Gauchos Cagers Defeat Torrance 26-19 in Marine League Upset

## Tartars Fail to Show Pre-Season Power at Lomita; Bees Also Lose

### MARINE HOOP GAMES TOMORROW

Narbonne at El Segundo; Torrance at San Pedro, and Gardena at Banning. Games start at 2:20 p. m.

Coach Wayne Schloss's cagers pulled off a major upset in the Marine League basketball race last Friday afternoon when they shellacked the highly-touted Torrance Tartars, 26 to 19 in the first game of the season. The defeat set the Torrance supporters back on their heels and added considerable prestige to the Lomita squad which, up to the start of the season, had not been rated very high.

The first quarter was fought on fairly even terms, ending four all, but the Gauchos held a 10 to 8 lead at the half and with Marvin Lee, lanky Torrance center, checked at every turn, increased the advantage thru the remainder of the game.

Alfred Trefethen, Narbonne forward, bailed the most points, scoring nine, but the Lomita center, Chuck Wheelchel, displayed the best consistent performance of the afternoon. He also scored eight points. The entire Narbonne team displayed beautiful team work.

The Torrance five, after starting out their practice season with a bang, seemed to lack the coordination necessary for a winning team. In the only other Marine League tussle of the day, San Pedro's varsity cleared its first hurdle by eking out a 25 to 22 victory over the Gardena Moleheads. The Pirates' Class B squad also won, nipping the scrappy Gardena Bees 16 to 14.

### GAUCHO BEES ALSO DEFEAT TARTAR FOES

By a score of 28 to 18, Narbonne's well-drilled Bees pasted a defeat on the Tartar Bees in the first league game of the season, played as a curtain-raiser to the varsity scrap at the Narbonne gym last Friday. Coach Pete Zamperini lacked substitutes to relieve his tired Tartars and was forced to end the game by playing an ineligible player with the consent of Coach Wayne Schloss.

### Pilots Spurn League Game With Oilers

Sampson refused to send his Pilots to El Segundo because the Athletic Policy-Determining committee of the Los Angeles city school system had ruled on Marine League claims that the Oilers were guilty of breaking rules and thus were ineligible to compete.

However, Principal John L. Abbott of Narbonne high school, head of the Marine League arbiters, had informed the Banning principal that it would be okay for the Pilots to play the Oilers pending the A. P. D. committee's final say-so in the dispute.

But Sampson scorned the Oilers' engagement, had his Pilots on the sidelines at the Narbonne-Torrance game to get a look-see at those two squads. The Policy-Determining committee is expected to rule on El Segundo's status today, it was reported.
