

Small Loan Guards Now In Effect

Protection for the person who secures a small loan is now in effect with the division of corporations ready to crack down on violators of the new usury laws approved on referendum last month.

The legislature passed the Wollenberg and Shelley bills to limit interest on small loans but they did not go into effect on Sept. 19 because of the referendum. The bills received an overwhelming majority on Nov. 7.

Fred A. Weller, chief assistant commissioner, warned borrowers to insist upon their rights under the new rules governing personal property lenders. For easy understanding, here are the major points:

1. All finance companies making loans, with or without security, must be licensed by the state.
2. Total rates of charge cannot exceed 2 1/2 percent on unpaid balances under \$10, and 2 percent on unpaid balances from \$10 to \$300.
3. The lender cannot require that any charges be paid in advance.
4. No lender or broker may exact any charge whatsoever unless a loan is actually made.
5. If illegal charges are made, the borrower need not repay any part of the loan or interest.

receive the full face amount of the loan and note he signs.

7. Forcing frequent renewals, for the purpose of exacting additional charges is prevented and prohibited.

8. The finance company must make a full disclosure to the borrower of all charges made and must give him a signed statement and copies of all loan papers.

Weller added that interest on loans over \$300 should be less than two percent per month.

County Drafting Law Forbidding Homes in Slough

Residential development will be prohibited in the Laguna Dominguez area, commonly known as Nigger Slough, and also on adjacent Johnson Lake, under the provisions of an ordinance being drafted today by County Counsel J. H. O'Connor on orders of the board of supervisors.

Any other similar areas where it would be hazardous to permit dwellings to be erected may also be subjected to the same restrictions, if in the supervisors' opinion it would be advisable. Supervisor Oscar Hauge of the Fourth district asked for the restriction.

Chief Engineer H. E. Hedger was asked to make recommendations as to any area his engineers believed dangerous for development. Had there been such an ordinance several years ago there would have been no dwellings erected in the paths of old channels in the La Crescenta-Montrose district which was swept by floods from a midnight cloudburst on January 1, 1934.
