NOTICE OF ANNEXATION ELECTION FOR ANNEXATION TO THE CITY OF GARDENA, CALIFORNIA, OF CERTAIN TERRITORY DESIGNATED AS "CRENSHAW TERRITORY"

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Gardena, California, has received a written petition asking that certain territory (therein and herein described and referred to as "Crenshaw Territory"), contiguous to said City of Gardena, be annexed to said City, which said territory is situated in the County of Los Angeles, State of California, and is more particularly described in said petition in words and figures as hereinafter in this notice described;

AND, WHEREAS, the said City Council of said City has found and determined that said petition is signed by not less than one-fourth, to-wit, by one-fourth and more in number of the qualified electors residing within the afore-said territory, as shown by the registration of voters of said Los Angeles County;

AND, WHEREAS, said territory so proposed to be annexed to said City, does not form a part of any municipal corporation, and it appears that said territory is inhabited and that the occupants thereof are bona fide residents of said territory;

AND, WHEREAS, said petition contained a request that the said City Council call a special election in said territory, proposed by said petition to be annexed to said City and submit to the electors residing in said territory his question whether said territory shall be annexed to, incorporated in and made a part of said City of Gardena;

AND, WHEREAS, as provided by law, said Council has duly held a hearing upon the said matter and has found and determined that no protests or objections of any kind have been received or made against such annexation or proposed annexation of said territory;

AND, WHEREAS, said Council did on the 19th day of December, 1939, duly pass and adopt a resolution, designated as "Resolution No. 159", entitled:

"A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDENA, CALIFORNIA, CALLING AND ORDERING THE HOLDING OF A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF JANUARY, 1940, IN THAT CERTAIN TERRITORY IN THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, DESIGNATED AS 'CRENSHAW TERRITORY', (WHICH SAID TERRITORY IS CONTIGUOUS TO SAID CITY AND PROPOSED TO

BE ANNEXED TO SAID CITY) FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE ELECTORS RESIDING IN SUCH TERRITORY THE QUESTION WHETHER SUCH TERRITORY SHALL BE ANNEXED TO, INCORPORATED IN AND MADE A PART OF SUCH MUNICIPAL CORPORATION; PROVIDING FOR THE HOLDING OF SUCH ELECTION AND THE GIVING OF NOTICE THEREOF."

which said resolution was approved by the Mayor of said City on the 19th day of December, 1939;

NOW, THEREFORE, notice is hereby given that in pursuance of the provisions of said Resolution No. 159 of the resolutions of the City Council of said City, and in accordance with the provisions of that certain act of the Legislature of the State of California, entitled, "An Act to Provide for the Alteration of the Boundaries of and for the Annexation of Territory to Municipal Corporations, for the Incorporation of such Annexed Territory in and as a Part thereof, and for the Districting, Government and Municipal Control of such Annexed Territory," approved June 11, 1913, and all acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, and designated and referred to as the "Annexation Act of 1913";

a special election has been called and will be held in that certain territory designated and known as Crenshaw Territory herein-after described, contiguous to said City of Gardena, on Tuesday, the 23rd day of January, 1940, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors residing in said territory hereinafter described, shall be annexed to, incorporated in and made a part of said City of Gardena, and the proposition to be submitted at said election shall be the following:

That it is proposed to annex to, incorporate in and make a part of said City of Gardena, the territory sought to be annexed.

That the territory proposed to be annexed to said City and in which said special election has been called and will be held as aforesaid is situated in the County of Los Angeles, State of California, and is more particularly bounded and described as follows:

All that territory outside the said City of Gardena, and in the County of Los Angeles, State of California, lying within the following described exterior boundary lines, to-wit:

Beginning at the point of intersection of the North line of Rosecrans Avenue with the East line of Normandie Avenue, said point being a point in the boundary line of the City of Gardena; thence Westerly along the North line of Rosecrans Avenue to its point of intersection with the North line of Compton Blvd.; thence Easterly along the North line of Compton Blvd. to its point of intersection with the boundary line of the City of Gardena; thence Northerly, Easterly, Westerly and Southerly along the boundary line of the City of Gardena, to the point of beginning.

That said territory has been heretofore and is hereby designated as "Crenshaw Territory", and said territory shall be referred to and indicated upon the ballots to be used at such special election as "Crenshaw Territory".

That upon the ballots to be used at such special election and in addition to the other matters required by law to appear thereon, shall be printed the following:

"Shall Crenshaw Territory be annexed to the City of Gardena, California?"

That there shall be two voting places to the right of and opposite such proposition.

That the qualified electors residing in said territory so proposed to be annexed to said City are hereby directed to vote upon the question of such annexation of said territory to said City by stamping a cross (x) in the voting square after the printed word "Yes", or by stamping a cross (x) in the voting square after the printed word "No".

If an elector shall stamp a cross (x) in the voting square after the printed word "Yes" the vote of such elector shall be counted in favor of such annexation of said Crenshaw Territory to the said City of Gardena. If an elector shall stamp a cross (x) in the voting square after the printed word "No" the vote of such elector shall be counted against such annexation.

That for the purpose of holding and conducting said special election one voting precinct designated as "Crenshaw Territory Annexation Election Precinct No. 1", has been established and the place at which the polls will be opened in said territory so proposed to be annexed to said City has been established and designated as hereinafter set forth, and the election officers for said precinct have been appointed as follows, to-wit:

Crenshaw Territory Annexation Election Precinct No. 1 shall be known as such and shall comprise all that portion of Moneta Precinct No. 2, as now established for State and County elections included within said territory;

The polling place thereof shall be at the residence 1820 W. 144th Street, within said precinct.

The officers of such election designated and appointed as such for said precinct are: Inspector: Joseph H. St. Onge Judge: Mrs. Helen L. Parker Judge: Mrs. Gatha F. Lange

The polls at said election will be open between the hours of 6 o'clock a. m. and 7 o'clock p. m. of said day of said election, except as provided in Section 1164 of the Political Code of the State of California.

The ballots to be used at said special election, the opening and closing of the polls and the holding and conducting of said special election shall be in conformity as near as may be, with the laws of the State of California concerning general elections, except as provided in the "Annexation Act of 1913" of the State of California.

The said election in all particulars shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of that certain act of the Legislature of the State of California, entitled: "An Act to Provide for the Alteration of the Boundaries of and for the Annexation of Territory to Municipal Corporations, for the Incorporation of such Annexed Territory in and as a Part thereof, and for the Districting, Government and Municipal Control of such Annexed Territory," approved June 11, 1913, known and referred to as the "Annexation Act of 1913"; and all acts amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto.
