

## Seek Federal Aid for Nigger Slough Flood Control

Incorporation of Laguna Dominguez (Nigger Slough) area in a federal flood control program for the next decade has been asked by the Southwest Cities Flood Control association in telegrams to Congressmen Low Geyer and Leland Ford. It was pointed out that this district has paid more than \$1,500,000 in county flood control assessments over a 25-year period without receiving adequate drainage.

The Southwest Cities group, comprised of city engineers and officials of Torrance, Inglewood, Hawthorne, Lawndale, Keystone and Lennox, is seeking to obtain a federal appropriation this year to start immediate flood control work.
