against the usurpation of our right to uninterrupted service of public officers as long as those officers are giving satisfactory service. We believe that generally speaking, the various departments of the city are being operated in an efficient manner. If reason for criticism exists, it is the American way to give the offending official an opportunity of conforming to the policies of the new administration.

"The master of officials for pure political reasons, however, cannot be tolerated in a community that has always had reason to be proud of the administration of its affairs. Such tactics strike at the very foundation of democracy.

"We urge most strongly that our rights as citizens be respected in this matter and that the Council refuse to support political chicanery.

County Engineer to Make Alondra Park Debt Study

What is regarded as a big step toward the ultimate re-assessment of Alondra Park's debt-ridden Mattoon Act district was taken today by the county board of supervisors. The board added \$32,440 to the county engineer's budget to provide for extra clerical services necessary to make a thorough study of all property in the district for the equitable spreading of the refunded debt.

The supervisors did not, however, vote the county's share from the general funds to cover half of the refunded debt. \$318,000 of the remaining \$683,000 in bonds against the Alondra Park district.

It is expected that the county engineer will begin his survey, which must ultimately stand a court test, in August and that the work will take from six to eight months. Final refunding of Alondra Park's Mattoon Act debt, which has proven an insurmountable barrier to the district's development, is expected within a year.

Normandie Dist. Meeting Called

A property owners' committee, working toward refunding of the Mattoon Act Bonds in the Normandie special assessment district announced this week that notification letters have been placed in mails to all owners of record in the district. These letters contain all information necessary to enable owners to do their part in completing the refunding.

Much work has been done since the attempt was started more than a year ago and now the committee believes that, with the cooperation of the county authorities, a plan has been worked out that will result in clearing the district of the unpleasant "Mattoon" type of assessments with the least hardship to all concerned.

To fully acquaint all owners with details of the refunding arrangements a mass meeting is to be held in the Torrance Civic Auditorium Thursday evening, May 9, at 7:30 p. m. The committee invites all owners to attend, particularly any owners in the district involved who have not received letters of notification due to faulty addresses. Mrs. Ada Green is chairman of the committee and Ralph R. Perry is secretary.
