## NOTICE OF HEARING ON PROPOSED REASSESSMENT FOR REFUNDING OF INDEBTEDNESS OF ACQUISITION AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 70 OF THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES

Notice is hereby given that the Reassessment and District No. 70 in the matter of the refunding of the outstanding indebtedness of Acquisition and Improvement District No. 70 has been filed with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles and may be examined by any person interested. The improvement to pay the costs and expenses of which said indebtedness was incurred was made pursuant to a resolution of intention adopted April 29, 1929, and reference is hereby made to such resolution of intention which is on file with said clerk for a description of the improvement.

The district of lands benefited by said improvement is described in general terms as follows and includes the lands lying within the following described exterior boundary line, to wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the northerly boundary of the City of Los Angeles (known as Shoestring Addition), with the northerly prolongation of the westerly line of Lot 88 of McDonald Tract, as shown on map recorded in Book 15, pages 21 and 22 of Miscellaneous Records of Los Angeles County; thence easterly in a direct line to the southwesterly corner of Lot 1 of Townsite of Avery, as shown on map recorded in Book 2, page 61 of Maps, records of said county; thence northerly in a direct line to the northwesterly corner of said last mentioned lot; thence easterly in a direct line through the northwesterly corner of said last mentioned lot to the easterly line of Normandie Avenue (formerly Vermont Avenue) as shown on said last mentioned map; thence southerly along said easterly line and southeasterly, easterly and northeasterly along the northeasterly, northerly and northwesterly lines of 182nd Street, described in deed to the County of Los Angeles, recorded in Book 4208, page 155 of Official Records of said county, to a line at right angles to Lot 1, Tract No. 8517, as shown on map recorded in Book 117, pages 32 and 33 of Maps, records of said county, and which passes through the most northerly corner of said last mentioned lot; thence southeasterly in a direct line to said most northerly corner; thence southerly in a direct line through the southeasterly corner of said last mentioned lot to aforesaid northerly boundary of the City of Los Angeles; thence easterly along said last mentioned northerly boundary to the certain course in the boundary of Lot A, Tract No. 4597, as shown on map recorded in Book 94, pages 79 and 80 of Maps, records of said county; thence southerly along said last mentioned northerly prolongation of the easterly line of Lot 24 of said last mentioned tract; thence southerly in a direct line to the southeasterly corner of Lot 13 of said last mentioned tract; thence southeasterly in a direct line to a point on the northerly line of Lot A of Hammond Tract, as shown on map recorded in Book 40, pages 2 to 4 inclusive, of Maps, records of said county, which is easterly thereon 1226.09 feet from the northwesterly corner of said last mentioned lot; thence southerly in a direct line to a point on the southerly line of Lot B of said last mentioned tract, which is easterly thereon 1228.05 feet from the southwesterly corner of said last mentioned lot; thence southerly in a direct line to the northeasterly corner of Lot 121 of said last mentioned tract; thence southerly in a direct line through the southeasterly corner of Lot 148 of said last mentioned tract, to the southerly line of East Road as shown on said last mentioned map; thence easterly in a direct line to the northeasterly corner of Lot 1 of Tract No. 4578, as shown on map recorded in Book 68, pages 1 and 2 of Maps, records of said county; thence southerly in a direct line through the southeasterly corner of said last mentioned lot to the center line of Carson Street, as shown on map of Tract No. 3239, recorded in Book 37, pages 27 and 28 of Maps, records of said county; thence westerly along said last mentioned center line to the

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northerly prolongation of the easterly line of Lot 2 of said last mentioned tract; thence southerly in a direct line through the southeasterly corner of Lot 63 of said last mentioned tract, to the southerly line of Ocean Street as shown on said last mentioned map; thence easterly along said last mentioned southerly line to a line which is parallel with and 600 feet easterly, measured at right angles, from the easterly line of Lot A, Tract No. 3020, as shown on map recorded in Book 31, page 19 of Maps, records of said county; thence southerly along said parallel line to a line which is parallel with and 30 feet southwesterly, measured at right angles, from the southeasterly prolongation of the southwesterly line of said last mentioned lot; thence southeasterly along said last mentioned parallel line to a line which is parallel with and 1160 feet easterly, measured at right angles, from the easterly line of Normandie Avenue as described in deed to the County of Los Angeles, recorded in Book 7185, page 119 of Deeds, records of said county; thence southerly along said last mentioned parallel line to the northerly line of Lot G as shown on Partition Map of the Rancho Los Palos Verdes, filed in Case No. 2373 of the District Court of the 17th Judicial District of the State of California, in and for the County of Los Angeles; thence southerly in a direct line to a point on the northerly line of Wilmington and Salt Works Road (50 feet wide) now Lomita Boulevard as shown on map of Tract No. 1589, recorded in Book 21, pages 38 and 39 of Maps, records of said county, which is easterly thereon 792.55 feet from the easterly line of Normandie Avenue as described in deed to the County of Los Angeles, recorded in Book 3816, page 90 of Official Records of said county; thence westerly along said last mentioned northerly line and the westerly prolongation thereof to a point which is westerly thereon 918.88 feet from the southwesterly corner of Lot 10 of San Pedro Villa Tract, as shown on map recorded in Book 7, page 126 of Maps, records of said county; thence northerly in a direct line to the intersection of the northerly line of Lot E of aforesaid Partition Map of the Rancho Los Palos Verdes, with a line which is parallel with and 1690 feet westerly, measured at right angles, from the westerly line of Normandie Avenue as described in aforesaid deed recorded in Book 7185, page 119 of Deeds; thence northerly along said last mentioned parallel line to a line which is parallel with and 30 feet southwesterly, measured at right angles, from the southwesterly prolongation of the southwesterly line of Lot 4 of Tract No. 5351, as shown on map recorded in Book 58, page 46 of Maps, records of said county; thence southeasterly along said last mentioned parallel line to a line which is parallel with and 300 feet westerly, measured at right angles, from the westerly line of Lot B of Tract No. 1890, as shown on map recorded in Book 21, page 49 of Maps, records of said county; thence northerly along said last mentioned parallel line to the southerly line of 228th Street (formerly Two Hundred Thirtieth Street) as shown on map of Tract No. 4529, recorded in Book 50, pages 64 to 66 inclusive, of Maps, records of said county; thence westerly along said last mentioned southerly line to the southerly prolongation of the westerly line of Lot 564 of said last mentioned tract; thence northerly in a direct line to the northwesterly corner of Lot 428 of said last mentioned tract; thence northerly in a direct line to the southwesterly corner of Lot 1, Block 5, of Tract No. 3371, as shown on map recorded in Book 38, page 80 of Maps, records of said county; thence northerly in a direct line to the northwesterly corner of Lot 1, Block 1, said last mentioned tract, being the southwesterly corner of Lot 1, Block 7 of Tract No. 3341, as shown on map recorded in Book 38, page 80 of Maps, records of said county; thence northerly in a direct line to the northwesterly corner of Lot 1, Block 1, said last mentioned tract, being the southwesterly corner of Lot 1, Block 7 of Tract No. 3308, as shown on map recorded in Book 38, page 32 of Maps, records of said county; thence northerly in a direct line to the northwesterly corner of Lot 1, Block 1, said last mentioned tract, being the southwesterly corner of Lot 1, Block 3, of Tract No. 4983, as shown on map recorded in Book 57, pages 6 to 9 inclusive, of Maps, records of said county;

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thence northerly in a direct line to the northwesterly corner of Lot 1, Block 71 of Tract No. 4983, as shown on map recorded in Book 58, pages 80 to 85 inclusive, of Maps, records of said county; thence northerly along the westerly line of Pacific Electric Railway Company's Right-of-Way shown as "Pacific Electric Railway Right-of-Way" on said last mentioned map, to the southerly line of Lot 87 of aforesaid McDonald Tract; thence westerly in a direct line to the southwesterly corner of said last mentioned lot; thence northerly in a direct line to the point of beginning, excepting therefrom the following lands which are not to be reassessed, said lands being used or held exclusively for the burial or other permanent deposit of the human dead or for the care, maintenance or upkeep of such property or such dead, and not held for profit, to wit: That portion of Lot A, Tract No. 4597, as shown on map recorded in Book 94, pages 79 and 80 of Maps, records of Los Angeles County, bounded easterly by a straight line joining a point in the northerly line of Lot 105, McDonald Tract, as shown on map recorded in Book 15, pages 21 and 22 of Miscellaneous Records of said county, easterly thereon 1275 feet from the westerly line of said Lot 105, with a point in the southerly line of said Lot A, easterly thereon 1274.48 feet from said westerly line; and all of the southerly 130 feet of the northerly 156.70 feet of said Lot 105, except that portion thereof lying within said Tract No. 4597.

Reference is hereby made to the diagram contained in said reassessment for the boundaries and extent of the said assessment district and said diagram shall govern for all details as to the extent thereof. Said diagram shows, each lot, piece or parcel of land reassessed and said reassessment shows the amount proposed to be reassessed upon each lot, piece or parcel of land.

Notice is further given that it is proposed to levy said reassessment for the refunding of the indebtedness of said district. The total amount of the proposed reassessment is the sum of Thirty-four Thousand One Hundred Twenty and 89/100 Dollars (\$34,120.89).

The total amount of the outstanding indebtedness to be refunded, as of September 14, 1939, the date the resolution of intention was adopted, is Seventy Thousand One Hundred Forty-four and 11/100 Dollars (\$70,144.11). Said outstanding indebtedness consists of Sixty-eight Thousand Two Hundred Forty and 89/100 Dollars (\$68,240.89) par value principal of bonds and One Thousand Nine Hundred Three and 22/100 Dollars (\$1,903.22) due and unpaid interest.

The sum of Thirty-four Thousand One Hundred Twenty and 89/100 Dollars (\$34,120.89) will be contributed by the County of Los Angeles to assist in such refunding.

Notice is further given that on the 28th day of May, 1940, at the hour of 10:00 o'clock A. M., at the chambers of the Board of Supervisors of said County in the City of Los Angeles is the time and place the said Board will hold the hearing on said reassessment. Protests or objections to said reassessment or to any proceedings taken in the refunding of said indebtedness and the levying of a reassessment therefor or to any part of such proceedings or to any specific reassessment upon any ground whatsoever must be filed in writing with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles at or before the time of said hearing. Upon the recording of said reassessment, the respective amounts reassessed shall be immediately due and payable. The reassessment proceedings are under and serial bonds shall be issued in the manner and form provided in an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, titled "An act to provide for the refunding of the indebtedness represented by bonds of special improvement districts payable from taxes or from special assessments levied wholly or partly in accordance with the assessed value of lands, to provide for the issue and sale or exchange of refunding bonds and the retirement of unpaid bonds of such districts, to provide for the levy of assessments or reassessments for the payment of such refunding bonds, to enforce the liens of such assessments or reassessments, to provide for proceedings to test the validity of such refunding and reassessment, to provide for contributions of public funds to assist in such refunding, and to provide for the use of Federal bankruptcy courts therein," and commonly known and designated as the "Assessment Bond Refunding Act of 1933," approved June 5, 1933, Statutes 1933, page 1915, and all acts supplementary thereto, incorporated by reference therein or amendatory thereof, to re-

present each reassessment remaining unpaid after the expiration of thirty days from the date of recording said reassessment. Said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of six percent (6%) per annum from the date of recording of such reassessment payable as provided in said Act, and the principal of said bonds shall be payable in ten (10) annual installments extending over the period of nine (9) years from the 2nd day of January next succeeding the 15th day of the next November following their date.
