

Esteemed Japanese Sudden Victim of Heart Disease

Not only the large Japanese colony but all Lomitanans who knew U. S. Aoki were shocked and grieved to learn of his sudden death last Sunday morning.

Mr. Aoki, who for 20 years had been in charge of vast ranching interests here, had gone to a neighbor's early Sunday morning. On returning to his home at Lomita and Hawthorne boulevards he collapsed in the yard. Death was due to heart disease.

Born in Japan 58 years ago, he came to America 30 years ago. Well educated in his own country, he proceeded to become educated in English and in American business. His keen interest in American government and institutions, honesty in business dealings and unfailing courtesy and thoughtfulness made him not only a leader among his own people but brought him the friendship of all Americans who knew him.

Yesterday afternoon his many friends gathered at the Jen Shu temple at Hewitt and East First streets in Los Angeles where services were held. The remains were cremated. He was survived by the widow, Imako, and five children living at the ranch on Lomita boulevard.

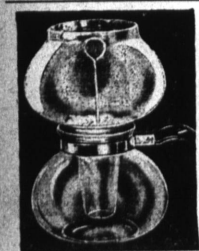
