Sod Worm Original Parachutist, Says Agriculture Expert

The parachute troop idea may have been borrowed originally from the lowly sod webworm moths, county agricultural experts commented this week in accounting for the damage being done to lawns in some localities.

What does this remind you of? The sod worm moth hides away in shrubbery during the day, but at dusk comes out to fly over lawns. The moth scatters its eggs promiscuously over the lawn, and they hatch within a week. The young act as skeletonizers on the grass blades, while the older worms feed on the greener parts of the crown and on tender growing tips of grass.

That's exactly the words Deputy County Agricultural Commissioner Howard Wilcomb used to explain the caterpillar works. The worms prefer young lawns, and blue grass and bent grass, and devastation may occur almost overnight.

Best method of control is a poison of five pounds of basic lead arsenite and two pounds of white flour in 50 gallons of water, which can be applied with a sprinkling can. Five pounds will treat 100 square yards, Wilcomb said.

Bears Also Have Toothache
BERKELEY, Cal. (U.P.)—Bears are probably the only American wild animals that enjoy the otherwise exclusively human attribute of having a toothache, the University of California has announced. The conclusion was reached after the examination of the teeth of 5,257 American wild animals. Only the teeth of bears showed dental caries.

Sepulveda, Son of San Pedro, Laid to Rest

Roman D. Sepulveda, San Pedro's grand old man, passed away Sunday in a Los Angeles hospital. Yesterday he was laid to rest, following services at Mary Star of the Sea church, in the family plot at Inglewood cemetery.

One of the few pioneers left who could remember when San Pedro, Lomita and Torrance were just part of a cattle ranch on which he was born—a ranch of 34,000 acres—Mr. Sepulveda was one of the very few who saw the scene change from hills dotted with sheep and cattle to hills covered with beautiful homes overlooking a world harbor.

Everyone who ever lived in San Pedro can remember Ramon Sepulveda in Spanish costume riding horseback downtown. He saw the building of the old Point Fermin lighthouse. He knew San Pedro when the name only applied to the harbor and the little town on the hills which have since been cut down was called Fayal. He saw the first rock hauled in for the breakwater and the last bit of dirt blasted away, destroying San Pedro's most distinctive landmark, Deadman's Island. He established the first water system and one of the first banks and developed beautiful Royal Palms.

Not many men today live nearly 86 years in the same town and see such remarkable changes. Vaya con Dios, Ramon Sepulveda—a true gentleman whom all called friend.
