WPA construction projects opened in Los Angeles county since August 1 have totaled more than one million dollars, while projects completed during the two-week period total \$575,611, it was announced this week by Herbert C. Logg, WPA Administrator for Southern California.

Total for all opening projects in the county since August 1 amounted to \$1,390,843, with the Ramona Boulevard storm drain, totaling \$674,492, and the first unit of the Lomita storm drain costing \$434,893, heading the list of nine construction jobs placed in operation.
