Local SWOC Lodge Has Float, Marchers In Labor Day Parade

Members of the Torrance C. I. O. unit, Milky Williams Lodge No. 1414, of the Steel Workers' Organizing Committee, marched with their impressive float entry in the C. I. O. Labor Day parade in San Pedro Monday. The float represented a Gargantuan steel worker rising above towering smokestacks of an industrial plant resembling the Columbia Steel Company's buildings here.

It was estimated that 12,000 participated in the parade, members of some 73 organizations affiliated with the C. I. O.
