# BUILDING Boom Gets Off to an Early Start

# Construction Sky-Rockets Early in Year

INDUSTRIAL and oil expansion, chiefly the General Petroleum corporation's refinery enlargement, and the quest for the rich, high-gravity "black gold" in the South Torrance field, is mainly responsible for this city's amazing building record for this year.

Nineteen thirty-eight was only 10 days old when General Petroleum knocked the props out of the 1937 building record by taking out the first of a series of building permits that amount to more than half of the total amount of construction here to date.

Deep-sand exploitation in the South Torrance oil field kept the city building figures tumbling over previous high records as scores of operators shot up derricks to make that area the liveliest production district in the state. Derrick permits have averaged nearly 10 a month here since the first of the year. Home Building Revives

A third major construction project so far this year has been the new \$100,700 high school assembly hall which was started March 28. Another school improvement here was the erection of two double bungalows and general renovation at the Walteria elementary campus.

Home building was a laggard in this construction cavalcade. Rising costs of materials earlier in the year contributed to diminished residence work and while prices leveled off, and in many instances, were lowered, still the anticipated family dwell- houses report an increased in-
