Four members would be onduty until the polls close at 7 p.m., when the other four members would report and proceed to tally the votes cast for the various candidates. This proposal has merit, county attorneys concluded, provided the members are paid \$6 instead of \$8 for the day's work, so that the total cost of the eight-member board where each is paid \$8.
