Payments would continue at this rate for about ten years, or until the 8-year-old child attained age 18. Total pay-ments in these ten years would approximate \$5,000. After the older child is 18, the mother and younger child receive benefits of \$30.00 per year, for three years at which time the younger child will have attained age 18. In those three years about \$1,300 of additional insur-ance will be paid bringing total payments in this. example to about \$7,300.
