That new formal in any swank women's dress shop may be the latest thing, but its basic fea-tures are probably not much dif-ferent from the style leader of 100 or 300 years ago. This is a conclusion of re-search on women's fashion by Dr. A. L. Krocher, professor of anthropology, and Dr. Jane Richardson, former Berkeley stu-dönt, in a new issue of Anthro-pological Records just issued by the University of California Press.

Basic Features This basic pattern—an ideal toward which European culture has been tending during recent centuries—requires that a skirt is both full and long, a waist that is abnormally constricted but in nearly proper anatomical position, and a neckline that is ample both vertically and hori-zontally.

The basic features studied for a \$22 year period were the width and length of the skirt or dress sad, or the skirt or dress sad, form the dimensions of the dress silhourtte as a whole, and are the only standard character-istics of dresses during the whole period. **Used Fortraits** The two most notable periods of fluctuation from the ideal were 1787-1885 and 190-38, the Nanoieonic and World War pe-riods and their aftermaths. These two periods contain more extenses of proportion than the intervening 75 years or the whole 18th century. Dr. Kroeber and Miss Rich-ardson used portraits by old masters, lithographed fashion plates, and fashion mazaines as sources for their study. A standard method of measurement of portraits and pletures was devised by the two anthropolo-sits. *** * ***
