

Pistol Club Plans New Program

Increase of the Torrance Police Revolver club's activities will be discussed at a meeting of members next Wednesday night, Nov. 27, at 7:30 o'clock in the police station. Secretary Tom Perkin said today plans are being made to donate two trophies, one to the shooter with the highest aggregate score for a six months' period and the other to the shooter showing the greatest improvement during the same period, which will begin Jan. 1, 1941.

Tartars Nose Out Banning In First Win Since 1938

It was a long time to wait—nine Marine league games having elapsed since Torrance defeated Narbonne 19 to 12 in 1938—but to the 2,500 spectators the 6 to 0 victory scratched out of the Banning Pilots by the Tartars last Friday afternoon was worth it.

That long-overdue winning touchdown came in the third quarter. It was due to be joined by another tally in fourth period when Torrance thundered down to the Banning four-yard line only to be deprived of the score when Bobby Golden fumbled a lateral, the ball being recovered by Banning's Posada who raced out of danger to the 20 yard stripe.

Bill Parton skirted around left end in a brilliant broken-field dash that took him 20 yards to the Banning 40-yard marker where he lateraled to Golden on being tackled. Golden's long legs scampered down the sidelines in full view of the rooting section to cross the goal stripe standing up for the winning touchdown. David Jacobs' kick for the extra point was no good.

Torrance outgained the heavier Banning grids who came here fresh from their upset win over Narbonne. Although the Tartar line could not stop the hard-plunging Banning backs, the secondary managed to stop the onrush and keep the invaders from thrusting more than once deep into Torrance territory.

In 1938 Torrance defeated Banning 7 to 0 for the first Tartar win in two years. Last year Banning reversed that decision, taking the Tartars 12 to 7.

Gauchos Crushed by Pirates 32-13 in Wild Game

A fighting spirit which is expected to give San Pedro high school the unprecedented honor of three Marine League football championships in one season enabled the Pirate varsity to defeat Narbonne's Gauchos 32 to 13 last Friday afternoon at Lomita. San Pedro twice came from behind to move one step closer to its first varsity grid crown in nearly 20 years.

The port city's Class B football team beat Narbonne 53 to 0 at Navy Field last Thursday to capture the Marine light-weight title and the Cees tripped annual Arts 14 to 6 last Wednesday for the Midget crown.

San Pedro's varsity rallied in the final half to overcome an early Narbonne lead and then ran wild in the closing minutes to take the thriller-diller. The Gauchos, taking advantage of the opening play break, scored in the first quarter.

Gauchos Score Early
After the kickoff Nick Brotis on the ground dropped the ball before the whistle had sounded and the referee awarded it to the Narbonne linesman who recovered.

John Walker passed 10 yards to Leo Stark and when hit Stark fumbled and the ball rolled forward five or so yards to John Van Mulligan who nabbed it and ran to the nine yard line. The Gauchos pitched four straight passes, completing one for three yards to the four yard line and were given a first down on the one yard stripe on pass intercept. Arceles Walker scored over right tackle.

San Pedro scored a safety later in the period when John Gilgo blasted his way through center to nab Walker behind the goal line after Dragich had kicked out of bounds on the Narbonne four.

March to Tally
The Pirates started a new drive on their 30 yard ribbon with Dragich scoring from the one yard stripe after Dick Bauer, Kordich and Ed Smith had marched through the Gaucho defense. Bauer, playing his best game of the season, turned in some sparkling ball packing in this drive, sweeping the end for 15 yards to the one yard line. He had previously made 26 yards after taking a lateral from Kordich.

Walker and Bill Gibson then put on a passing display that had the Pirate defense dizzy. The first heave was a 35-yarder to midfield and another put the oval on the Pirate 35. Then another move into the end zone, on which interference was called against San Pedro gave the Gauchos the ball on the one yard line and Walker scored. Gibson converted to make the score 13-8.

Narbonne Stars
While San Pedro outclassed the Gauchos when they finally started rolling, the Pirates had some anxious moments. Walker, Coach Bill Sloan's pitching ace, without any reasonable doubt, earned his spurs as an all-leaguer. Besides his throwing, Walker stopped San Pedro runners time after time from his safety position. Jack Hollar, moved from his tackle spot to fullback, did some mighty nifty work in protecting Walker while throwing. On more than one occasion Hollar brought down two Pirate rushers. Lonnie Bowman and Stanley Steenbock were outstanding linesmen and stopped cold every San Pedro thrust thru the center of the line. Ray Cheek played a bang-up game at halfback and Gibson's pass snagging entailed him to serious consideration for any all-league selections.

Marine Grid Season Closes Tomorrow

With San Pedro expected to take possession of the 1940 Marine League championship, the high school football season will draw to a close tomorrow afternoon. The Pirates take on the Torrance Tartars at Navy Field, beginning at 2:30 o'clock, while Gardena plays at Banning. Narbonne ended its grid season last Friday by taking a 32 to 18 beating from San Pedro.

Of course there's the P.T.A. Football Carnival in the Los Angeles Coliseum left on the calendar and that will be staged Friday, Nov. 29. But the league schedule ends tomorrow — one week overdue on account of the rain Oct. 25 that forced postponement of all games.

Winners over Banning and Narbonne and tied by Gardena (0 to 0), San Pedro expects no trouble in taking the Torrance Tartars into camp. Likewise, Gardena should defeat Banning and thus take second place in the final standings. Torrance is assured of third spot—something quite different from the cellar berth held by the Tartars the last two seasons.

Narbonne, defending champions this year, ran into a lot of tough luck and injuries which marred its season and forced the Gauchos to end their play last Friday in the tall spot, possibly to share that position with Banning.

More Motor Deaths In Whole Country
With detailed nation-wide figures now available for the first nine months of 1940, a survey shows a 7 per cent rise in motor vehicle fatalities in the United States over the same period last year.

Since the first of the year the fatality trend has climbed with July the only month to show a decrease over 1939. Up to October 1 the count of traffic dead stood at 23,830 persons, an increase of 1,000 over the 22,330 victims during the first nine months of last year.
