Names of every person in this community who did not, for any reason, vote at either the August primary or the November general election are being removed from the great register of the county by a staff of clerks in the office of Registrar of Voters W. M. Kerr. The procedure is required by law after each general election. Kerr's staff this week was winding up the canvass of the votes cast at the November election, and preparing to make the required report to Secretary of State Paul Peek.

Count of absentee ballots showed that while President Roosevelt carried the county easily, Wendell Willkie received H,397 absentee votes as against 11,663 for President Roosevelt.

About 50 persons are registering as voters, many of them for the first time, at Kerr's office at Broadway and Third streets. Most of the registrants are men, who indicated by their conversation that they intended to apply for jobs in plants where preference is given to voters of this county.


