Should the Axis powers win the war, Dr. Wellman said, the United States will probably be isolated in a totalitarian world. International trade would be carried by powerful nations as a weapon in a struggle for political and economic domination. One consequence of this Dr. Wellman believes, would likely be a serious curtailment of our agricultural exports, particularly of such relative nonessential products as fruit.
