Huge 'Man-Hunt' In Progress for **National Defense**

The U. S. department of the interior is conducting in Call-fornia and other western states one of the largest and most widespread "man-hunts" on record, according to a report received here from Washington.

The hunt is being conducted by the department in connection with its work in making available more than 8,000,000 acres of public domain for national defense purposes. The search is for approximately 50,000 holders of early mining claims in the west. The task, which in some instances involves the tracing of claim ownership dating back more than 70 years, is one of the most unusual and complex in the department's activities.

It is estimated search for approximately 30,000 individuals may have to be made before the task is completed. Already, several thousand persons have been sought in connection with negotiations involving the 500,000 acre Murco army bombing range in California.


