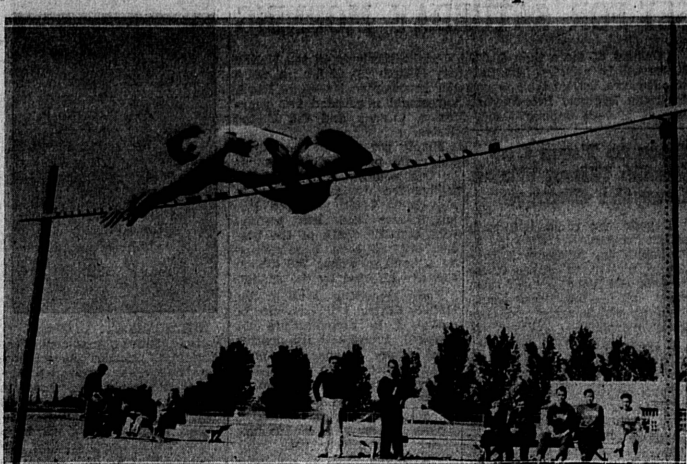

Stewart Breaks L.B. Jump Record

One of these days Bill Stewart, Torrance high grad, is going to crack the world's high jump record. He gave every indication that his performances this spring will bring him over the 6 ft. 10 in. mark when he soared 6 ft. 7 1/2 in. to set a new record in the Long Beach Events. Bill shattered the old record of 6 ft. 7 1/2 in. made by Cornelius Johnson back in 1938.

Wearing his old Torrance high track suit because he was competing unattached in the meet, Stewart defeated the favored Johnny Wilson and Gil LaCava, both of U. S. C. While they failed to clear 6 ft. 7 in. the Torrance jumper, coached by Pete Zamperlin, cleared each height on his first attempt.

Stewart attempted a 6 ft. 10 in. jump but his afternoon of almost continuous springing, plus the excitement of the crowd that jammed around the high sticks worked against him. He actually cleared the bar twice but knocked it down each time with his arm.

Hall Third in Mile
Bill was registered at U. S. C. last year but was ineligible for competition as a Trojan at the Long Beach meet. He is undecided whether to reenter S. U. or go to Duke University.

Another Torrance product, John Hall, took third place in the invitational mile, which was won by Marston Girard, former Stanford star running for the Olympic club, in the new meet time of 4:19.7, three-tenths of a second better than the mark established by Louie Zamperlin in 1939.

Because Hall placed—he was third last year in the event—in the mile, the 1941 Long Beach meet marked the third straight year in which Torrance long-distance runners finished among the leaders in that event. Zamperlin won it three consecutive years.

Eight Indians Ending Season Next Sunday

Defeating Pacific Clay 8 to 2, and Chamberlain's Pasadena Athletics 4 to 1, the Torrance Indians ran their win streak up to eight victories Sunday.

Ambrose Palica pitched the first game, allowing but four hits. In the second fray with the Athletics, Karl Swing, a boy from Colton, held them to five hits.

Next Sunday will see last action for eight ball players with the Indians. Reporting to training camp in Flint, Michigan, will be: Ambrose Palica, Cliff Mages, Karl Swing, Al Radomins and Art Bonnell. Going to Charleston, West Virginia, are: Gordon Evans and Hughie Lapham. To the Cedar Rapids branch in the three-I league goes Kaki Conzator, who plays the center garden pretty well.

Torrance Plays Dorsey Saturday for Invitational Tourney Title

Day after they lost to San Pedro 7 to 0, the unpredictable Torrance Tartar baseball team trounced the Pirates 4 to 2 in the semi-finals of the Dorsey invitational tourney and thus won the right to play Dorsey next Saturday afternoon for the title.

This crucial game will be played at the Rancho Cienega playground adjoining Dorsey high's field on Diamond No. 1. This field may be reached by local supporters of the team who drive up La Brea to Exposition Blvd. Ample parking is available at Exposition and La Brea.

The Tartars advanced behind the three-hit hurling of Clair Johnson and tallied two runs in the fifth on an outfield error to get the decision. This was Johnson's first pitching assignment.

Coach Bob Barr's players got five hits off Honeywell. Fred Hicks caught for the Tartars. Johnson, who poled a three-bagger, and Hicks, who got two hits in three times at bat, lead in the slugging department.

Banning, undefeated in the Marine league play, forfeited his consolation round tilt to Huntington Park, eliminating another Marine league squad: Huntington Park opposes Los Angeles high in the consolation finals.

While San Pedro was handing a Marine league shut-out to Torrance last Friday, Narbonne wall-poled El Segundo to retain its position in the standings—the score being 12 to 3.

Wild Flower Bulletin Available Now at State C.C. Office

Now that it is quite apparent that Spring is here to stay, the Travel and Recreation department of the California State Chamber of Commerce, suggests planning a weekend to the wildflower areas for which California is famous.

As an aid to the tourists they have issued their 1941 edition of the Wildflower Bulletin which outlines tours to these wildflower areas and the time when the flowers are at their best.

In addition, the bulletin also includes a description of the most common varieties which will aid the motorists in identifying wildflowers. There is also a list of the common wildflowers according to color, giving their common and scientific name.

Tourists are reminded of the Penal Code, concerning the destruction of trees, shrubs, and plants. As wildflowers are one of this state's greatest travel lures, it is important that every-thing possible be done to preserve them. This Penal Code is included in the Wildflower Bulletin.

Highway 6 and 395, Carpet Dandelion, Desert Mariposa Lily, Buttercup, Desert Candle, Sand Verbena, Baby Blue Eyes and many others are beautiful now. The Joshua tree blossoms, although they have not quite reached their height, are worth driving to see.

Around Arvin, Bakersfield, California, Grapevine, Kernville and Shafter, fields of wildflowers nationally famous as to variety and extent, are now forming colorful carpets.
