ORDINANCE NO. 325 - AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 275 BY ADDING THERETO SUBSECTION G

The City Council of the City of Torrance does ordain as follows: Section 1. That Ordinance No. 275 designated as 'An Ordinance of the City of Torrance regulating parking, loading and unloading on certain public highways in the City of Torrance' be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto Subsection G under Section 1.

G. Marcelina Avenue from Sartori Avenue to Cravens Avenue; El Prado from Border Avenue to Cravens Avenue; the west side only of Cabrillo Avenue from Sartori Avenue to Carson Street.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after the date of its adoption and prior to expiration of fifteen days from the passage thereof shall be published at least once in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in the City of Torrance, and thenceforth and thereafter the same shall be in full force and effect.
