

Voters favoring the recall of Councilmen Powell, Murray and Babcock were cautioned this week by the Citizens' Committee for Good Government that in order to have their votes count against all three recallees it would be necessary to stamp their ballots in THREE PLACES, in the "Yes" column opposite EACH of the three councilmen's names.

The Citizens' Committee also strongly urged that voters designate that the vacancies should be filled "BY SPECIAL ELECTION."

Unless the majority of voters favor a "special election" it will be necessary, under California Law for the City Council to fill the vacancies by appointment; and because the recallees hold their offices until their successors qualify. Powell, Murray and Babcock could, even after being recalled, select their own successors as they have a majority on the council. No sensible person desires any such result, it was pointed out.
