### Keystone Illness Blamed on Flood Conditions

County flood control engineers dodged responsibility for the drainage of the Keystone area of Laguna Dominguez, formerly Nigger Slough, in a reply to the American Red Cross this week in which the demand was made that the flood conditions in the area be relieved.

The Red Cross acted as the result of high water conditions last spring, following the prolonged rains of the past winter. Numerous eggspools had overflowed, school attendance at the Carson street school was cut one-fourth and sickness was prevalent as result of damp conditions, the county officials were told by the harbor district chaplain.

Chief Engineer H. E. Hedger of the flood control district said that the Keystone area was "basically a local drainage problem" and was not considered under jurisdiction of the flood control district.

Channel Being Enlarged

He also called attention to an ordinance adopted several years ago by the board of supervisors, declaring unfit for human habitation the area bounded by Aviation boulevard, Hawthorne ave., 20th street and State street.

Enlargement of the channel that drains Laguna Dominguez now is under way, extending from Carson street downstream to the Richfield refinery, Hedger said, and this will reduce ponding in the main part of the slough between Carson and Main street.

More Relief in Sight

County Engineer Alfred Jones has proposed a drainage system for East Torrance, to relieve the area of 220th street and Vermont while the Lomita boulevard drainage system will relieve the westerly section of Lomita.

Revision of certain road culverts might provide more relief for the slough, Hedger told the Red Cross officials.

The civilian defense move was started in the county by Sheriff Eugene Biscailuz some time ago, but plans were held in abeyance

pending Governor Olson's appointment of a state chairman, Stroh said. The program calls for an organized plan to prevent sabotage and give immediate relief in cases of disaster.
