## 1.284 New State Laws Effective on Sept. 13

# Los Angeles county taxpayers were assured of a reduced tax burden this year as a result of action by the Board of Supervisors in adopting a rate of \$1.4827. This rate, reflecting a reduction for the third successive year, was 1.22 cents below last year's rate of \$1.4749. It is a reduction of 4.73 cents below the \$1.51 rate of 1938-39, when the successive reductions started. "These continued reductions have been made by operating efficiencies despite steadily increasing costs for relief," Colonel Wayne Allen, chief administrative officer, explained. "Since 1927 our inescapable costs for aged aid, blind aid and orphan aid alone have increased \$3.494.517 or 14.5 cents on the tax rate." Of the \$1.4827 rate, \$.7766 will he for charity aid and \$6921.

517 or 14.5 cents on the tax rate."

Of the \$1.4627 rate, \$.7708 will be for charity aid and \$.6921 for ail the other governmental services. This rate will raise a total of \$34,960,343 as against a total of \$34,960,340 as against ecunty rate, tax bills will include a flood control district rate of 22 cents, the same as last year, and a Metropolitan Water District rate of 48 cents as against 49 cents for last year. In unincorporated areas the special county library rate will be 6.25 cents, the same as last year, and the road district rate 6 cents as against 5.85 cents of a year ago. To this must be added the city and school district taxes established in the various areas, as well as special district taxes levied for special services.
