Poker playing in Gardena was in a state of suspended anima-tion today as result of three raids last week on two clubs there. Seven men were arrested, several hundred patrons had their evening's pleasure abruptly halted and the raiding officers confiscated everything that was n't actually nailed down.

Attorneys for the defendants are battling it out today before Judge F. H. Love of Glendale who issued the search and ar-resting warrants after receiving complaints from a resident of his city who asserted he was a victim of "card sharks" at the two places. Sheriff's deputies connected with the vice detail broke up card games at two Western ave-clubs in Gardena last Friday night and at on of the places arrested three men on suspicion of solicitation of gambling. The officers, assisted by district at-tofficers, assisted by district at-torney's investigators, swooped dewn on the Montery club at the intersection of Western and 182nd st, where they arrested Ernie Prim, asserted manager of the club; Frank Martin, assist-ant manager, and Frank Cogs-well, another aide. They were immediately taken before Police Judge Elmo Mar-r's of Gardena and were released on \$100 bail each pending their trial. The officers dispersed 150 patrons of the club and seised 24 tables and other parapherna-lia as evidence.

**Job-Selling** 

Another vice squad of 10 dep-utles raided the Gardena club at Western and 156th st., where 100 persons were dispersed and 15 tables confiscated, Officers said the man named in the warrant, issued by Police Judge F. H. Lowe of Giendale, could not be found and there were no arrests. The Gardena police department did not participate in the raids. Saturday night another group of vice-raiders returned to the Gardena club where they are reported to have arrested Clar-ence Philbin and Lester K. Tup-per on "solicitation" charges. Later two more men were nab-bed and all released later on \$500 bail each. Fifty patrons were dispersed in the Saturday night call of the sheriff's depu-ties. The Monterey club has an ap-peal decision pending from a previous case in which the op-erators maintained that under state law, draw poker is legal in California.


