

### Bad News About To Break—Tax Bills Coming

Just in case you want to be prepared... Preparations for mailing the new county bills, due and payable Nov. 1 and delinquent Dec. 5, were being made this week by County Tax Collector H. L. Byram.

With each tax bill will be en-

closed a folder "What We should Know About Our Taxes," which gives the taxpayer a rough idea of where the \$101,725,000 in tax money comes from and some idea of where it goes.

Administration of county government will cost \$8,045,000 this year, amounting to about 12 per cent. The folders sent out with the 1938 tax bills showed that administration costs were but \$6,962,000 but this year's budget includes \$1,450,000 for a proposed new county courts building.

All Costs Increase Taxpayers who have saved

these folders for the past several years will find other interesting comparisons. The total budget expenditures for 1938-39 were shown to be only \$89,281,000, or some \$12,000,000 under this year's total budget. Although private employment is considerably higher than in 1938, the new budget allows \$9,696,000 for institutional care this year, as against only \$8,865,000 in the 1938-39 budget.

The county's increasing responsibilities are shown in other ways. This fiscal year the county is maintaining 4266 miles of roads, as compared with only

3896 miles in the 1938-39 budget. Cost of operating the superior courts, 24 township justice courts, municipal courts in Los Angeles and Long Beach, the county clerk's office and the county grand jury will be \$2,257,000 this year, as against only \$2,137,000 three years ago. Part of this is due to action of the last Legislature in raising the salaries of superior court judges.

### Better Be Sure You Have Right Driver's License

Motorists of this community who are still driving with "good until revoked" licenses should lose no time in going to the nearest office of the Department of Motor Vehicles and having them renewed. Orders have been given State Highway Patrol officers to issue citations to all persons driving with such licenses.

The order instructs Highway Patrol officers to give an order of cancellation to drivers with good until revoked licenses and to instruct them to get new licenses at once. The officer will make periodic checks in which all passing motorists will be required to exhibit their licenses.

All good until revoked licenses were cancelled several months ago as a safety move designed to eliminate unfit drivers. Those seeking new licenses will be required to submit to a visitor test, a written examination on common driving rules and to demonstrate their ability to drive safely.

The Department of Motor Vehicles estimates there are some 200,000 persons still operating motor vehicles with cancelled good until revoked licenses.

### Civilian Health Said Important Wartime Factor

LOS ANGELES—An army may march on its stomach—but in wartime it is just as important to be concerned about the nutrition problems of the civilian population, declares Dr. Asta Ohn Gee of the University of California Extension Division's teaching staff.

"Today's warfare comes from the air, which means that if and when bombs start falling, civilians live a jackrabbit's life. Nurses, teachers, district wardens and all persons who have charge of directing civilian activities must run a 'three-ring circus' during emergencies."

In such emergencies, the University of California lecturer says a knowledge of the fundamentals of nutrition is important but also the disposition of all concerned: "It is a matter of knowing which are the right foods to carry—those which possess quick energy, staying power, potency in vitamins, richness in minerals, high palatability, and lightness in weight.

"War or no war, it is well worthwhile for everyone, especially nurses and teachers who have so much to do with the well-being of many people daily to know how to keep them well and happy by setting the table with attractive and properly balanced meals. The study of nutrition is now universally recognized as a branch of curative as well as preventive medicine. Nutrition and hygiene should go hand in hand in the care of all people," declares Dr. Gee.
