

Put to Council

Urging the creation of a special fund to be used to attract industries to Torrance and particularly a grant of \$1,500 at once to acquire another unit of the Doak Aircraft Co., at his Torrance Industrial Properties, William A. Drennan gave the city council Tuesday night some pointers on how industries can be obtained for this city.

His suggestions were contained in a letter to President Dean Sears of the Chamber of Commerce which was forwarded to the council. The communication was filed for future consideration on Councilman George V. Powell's motion.

Drennan reported that two buildings at the Industrial Properties site on Border ave. have been leased, one to the Doak firm and the other to a furniture manufacturing concern. He said that there is keen competition nowadays among cities for plants linked with the rapidly expanding aircraft industry. Donations of acreage, nominal rents, outright cash gifts, property improvements are being used as inducements to the firms for locating in various Southern California cities.

He reported that the Doak firm will lease an additional building on Border ave, south of 222nd st. for more production space to include an assembly plant but the building must be remodeled to permit a 153-foot assembly line. Drennan said this would cost \$2,000 or more and he asked for a \$1,500 contribution, asserting that the taxes accruing the city will be more than this sum in "less than three years."


