They havd lived there for the past eight or nice years. The following graphic story of her experience with the Japanese invasion was cabled from the lands yesterday.) They didn't frighten me. I had lived in the wilds of the Philippines for the last six years and knew the country and the picopic around Legaspi well. My husband, Jack Sherk of Bowman, Calif., was superin-tending the salvage of a boat near Legaspi (250 miles south-cast of Manila) which sank two years ago. Friday morning. I had traveled as fast as I could, running much of the way.
