Royce Tidwell's Name on City's Gold Star Roll

While he was not a resident of Torrance, this city adds the name of Private Royce Tidwell to its gold star honor roll of local men killed while in the service of the nation because his parents, Mr. and Mrs. T. F. Tidwell, have been residents at 1800 216th st. since May, 1940. They came here from San Pedro, where Royce lived. Tidwell is a ship fitter at the California shipyards and was formerly employed by the C. C. J. O.

Royce entered Army service March 24, 1941, when he was inducted at Fort MacArthur from a Long Beach Selective Service district. He was killed Aug. 24, 1941, as result of an automobile accident near Fort Knox, Kentucky, where he had been sent from the coast. He was attached to a military police unit and was on duty at the time of his death.

Private Tidwell was born in Denison, Texas, Oct. 7, 1914, and came to California with his mother and older brother, Haskell, in April, 1923. He attended Fifth Street and 19th Street schools and San Pedro high school, graduating with the Winter class of 1934. He was keenly interested in music and athletics and learned the trombone at the San Pedro Y. M. C. A. He also was active in De Molay lodge work.

Former Harbor City Man Wounded
James Grinnell, formerly of Harbor City and son of Mrs. Bessie O'Harrow, was among those injured in the Pearl Harbor attack Dec. 7, 1941, according to word received by Harbor City friends this week. The information stated that Grinnell is recovering from burns. His present station was not disclosed. Grinnell formerly attended school in Lomita.

(Continued from Page 1-A) change. Postoffices have been designated as the places where this registration will be made. General DeWitt said arrangements were being made to have registration forms issued these offices as rapidly as facilities permit.

Gradual Exclusion
In speaking of his proclamation, the general indicated that future proclamations forthcoming shortly would affect five classes of people. These are: Class 1, all persons who are suspected of espionage, sabotage, fifth-column or other subversive activity; Class 2, Japanese aliens; Class 3, American-born persons of Japanese lineage; Class 4, German aliens; Class 5, Italian aliens. Persons in Class 1 are being apprehended daily by the F. B. I. and other intelligence services.

Complete Evacuation
The general stated that German and Italian aliens would be next on the list of evacuation, but they probably would not be affected until after the Japanese have been removed. He said that German and Italian aliens of 70 years of age or over would not be required to move except when individually sus-
