

Next Monday morning, little Jimmle Watson will draw the first 10 cards of men between 20 and 44 who registered Feb. 18, 17 and 18. Jimmle, four-year-old son of Mrs. Doris Watson, assistant clerk to Selective Service Board No. 280, will thus begin the board's big job of assigning serial numbers by lot to the 3,000 men of this district who responded to the third national "R" day. The youngster will perform his first service for his country at 9 o'clock at 1330 El Prado, Torrance, and the board is expected to take the rest of the day in placing serial numbers on the registration cards. On March 17 at Washington, D. C., a repetition of the hazitonal draft lottery of Oct. 29, 1940, will be held to determine the order in which the registration for service.

Officials of the local board called attention this week to the fact that they have orders which forbid any Selective Service registrant from enlisting after he has received instruction to report for Army physical examination. The only exceptions to this rule are men with specialist ratings.

The local board also announced that a news report published last week that Dean Dec Cox of Torrance and Frank Orla Hinekley of the board' was in error. The mistake, board officials declared, was made by Army authorities at Ft. MacArthur who sent the two young men to Ft. Knock (Ny., when they were scheduled to enter Air Corps training. The local board members insisted they were only following orders and that these instructions were well known to the young men and their parents.

Hereafter, whenever a draft registrant is ordered to report for medical examination, he must be prepared to be inducted immediately if he is found physically fit The examinations are generally given in either Los Angeles or at Ft. MacArthur. A selectee must show good reason, important business or home affairs, to obtain a leave to return home after examination.
