Young Laughton began his career as a boy wonder in Tulsa, Okla. His first instrument was a violin, on which he was playing solos at the very tender age of four. He represented Oklahoma on a patriotic tour with his family to Cuba and Panama when he was seven and gave a command performance for Henry Ford the following year. It was the same year that he switched from the violin to the harp to start a career that's bringing him fame today. At 16, he joined the Oklahoma City Symphony or e he stra as the youngest harpist in the world.
