### HOW TO AVOID LAYING UP CAR

What effect will the war have on motorists of America? It has been freely predicted that, inside a year, half of this country's 27,500,000 passenger cars will be off the road—laid up for the duration.

Is this literally true, or is it just guesswork? Most every motorist is determined that his own car will NOT be one of those laid up. He knows that automobiles were built to operate indefinitely. He knows that there are 10, 20 and even 30-year-old cars still in good mechanical condition, and still serving their owners on the highways.

Today's uppermost problem is tires. A large majority will lick this one by driving at moderate speeds, keeping the tires well inflated, and having them frequently inspected and cross-switched, thus adding 6 months or a year to the normal life of rubber which is so important to them.

One of the next problems to arise will be that of parts replacements. Some method of handling this will probably be devised. However, the best way to protect yourself from the necessity of finding parts for your car is to protect those parts with adequate and correct lubrication, making essential changes of oil and grease at the mileage periods specified on the Mobil X-Ray Chart.

### Orville W. Hudson Promoted to Sergeant

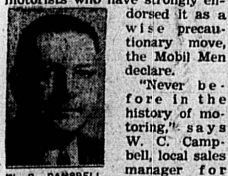
