WON'T BE LONG NOW BEFORE ALL HIGHWAY SIGNALS WILL OPERATE

Nothing but waiting for part of the controls now delays the complete operation of highway signals on Pacific Coast highway in Lomita. The long awaited signals started to work Monday afternoon on Walnut, Eshelman, Oak and Narbonne corners and the two signals on Cypress and Pennsylvania will be operating within a week or ten days.

The Newberry Electrical Corporation of Santa Monica started work in September, after receiving the contract at an estimate of \$10,600 and would have had the system completed if there had not been difficulty over priority of steel signal heads and other equipment.

Parents of children attending the Orange Street school can at last cease to worry over their children crossing the highway.

Norman Gardner, who has been one of the business men of Pacific Coast highway who has clamored for signals on the highway, was the first Lomitan to stop for the signal. Driving along Monday with no thought that the signals would soon be working, Gardner suddenly saw one of the signals flash red and came to a quick stop.

The Newberry Electrical Company was trying out the first signal. Within a few hours the signals east of Narbonne were working regularly and on Tuesday the one at Narbonne and 101 was ready. It may be a few days before the signals are ready at Cypress and Pennsylvania.

California Incomes Gain 22 Percent During Past Year

With preparation for the dominant factor in the economy of California, individual incomes of residents during 1941 were estimated to have been \$6,950,000,000, an increase of 22.4 percent over incomes of 1940, the California State Chamber of Commerce said today.

In 1941, income payments were 43.8 per cent larger than in 1936, with Solano county showing the greatest change since 1936 by more than doubling.

Water Storage Suggested for All Families

BERKELEY—California farm families were advised today to keep at least two days' supply of water for drinking and cooking on hand in clean containers and to make provisions for water for livestock in case of an emergency which would find

normal water supplies disrupted. The warning came from the University of California Agricultural Extension Service and the State Department of Public Health, agencies which are now cooperating with the State Council of Defense in a statewide survey of emergency water sources.

Glass bottles or clean milk cans will be suitable for storage of water for the family, said the statement, and all tanks, troughs, and reservoirs should be kept filled as sources of water for livestock. The water

should be changed frequently. In addition, the statement recommended that the family be prepared to transport water in clean containers from near-by towns, or from wells or springs known to be safe, and to be prepared to disinfect water of doubtful purity. Windmills, hand pumps, and other sources of power that could be used for pumping in case electric power is cut off should be kept in good repair, the statement added.

"Patriotic Racket" Nipped by Supervisors

A new county ordinance to regulate the peddling of patriotic emblems and similar articles in unincorporated areas of the county has been adopted by the board of supervisors.

The ordinance does not apply to the sale of patriotic emblems as part of a solicitation for funds for any charitable association if the person soliciting and the organization ob-

tains a license from the county. Presence of numerous fake solicitors, who pin a small flag or other emblem on coat lapels of passersby and then demand payment, are the target of the new regulation.
