



**Evolution of Our Flag** 



Taunton, Massachusetts, 2 years before the signing of the Declaration of Independence was the scene of the hoisting of one of the first efforts of the colonies to adopt a flag of their own. Here, in 1774, was unfurled the so-called "Taunton Flag," which was, in reality, the Meteor Flag of England, red flag with the Union Jack in the upper left hand corner,
