Tire Rationing **Rules Amended**

An amendement to the tire rationing regulations which tightens requirements in some respects and extends eligibility for tires to certain automobile users heretofore not provided for, has been issued by the Office of Price Administration.

The amendment does the following things:

1. Requires that a vehicle operated by a physician, surgeon, farm veterinary or practicing minister, to be eligible for tires and tubes, must be used "exclusively" for professional services or religious duties instead of "principally" as heretofore.

2. Makes licensed 'chiropractors and osteopaths eligible under the same conditions as apply to doctors of medicine.

3. Extends the eligibility of ministers to "any religious practitioner qualified to administer to the religious needs of the members of a congregation."

4. Changes the designation of nurses eligible for tires from "visiting nurses" to "public health nurses."

5. Extends eligibility for recapped tires to public school officials and teachers for necessary transportation between schools.
