Island Valuations Cut In Half

More than \$1,000,000 in assessed valuation was knocked off the 1942 assessment roll late Monday when a blanket cut of 50 per cent in the valuation placed on all land and improvements on Catalina Island was made by the county board of equalization. Every property owner on the island, and not only the Santa Catalina Island Co., which originally petitioned the board for reductions, will benefit by the board's action. The action was taken because the island has become a veritable military fortress, with no regular transportation between the mainland. Resorts all are closed.

City Ambulance Arrives, Awaits Presentation

The new \$1,800 City of Torrance ambulance, which arrived here late last week, is receiving its final decoration and polishing preparatory to its formal presentation to the community at a ceremony being arranged by the Kiwanis club, sponsor of the fund which was raised from many sources to pay for the vehicle. The four-patient International vehicle is temporarily quartered at the fire department garage. Painted white, it bears in gold leaf on its sides the words: "City of Torrance Ambulance. Sponsored by the Torrance Kiwanis Club." The official Civilian Defense insignia is borne on the side panels of the ambulance.

Winning Workers Accident Claims Life of 15-Year-Old Boy Here

Charles Roy O'Brien, 15-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. William E. O'Brien, of 1301 Crenshaw Blvd., succumbed Monday afternoon to injuries suffered early that morning when a milk truck, driven by his friend, Robert O'Toole, 15, overturned on Carson St. in the 1600 block O'Toole, son of Mr. and Mrs. James J. O'Toole, of 1225 Madrid ave., said he swerved the truck to avoid hitting two cats which were crossing the street. Following an examination of the mishap, a coroner's jury returned a verdict stating that the death of young O'Brien was due to an accident and exonerated young O'Toole of all blame. The latter testified and once during his statement nearly broke down from emotion.

Tax Delinquency Payments Gain

Increase of more than \$500,000 in payments on tax delinquent property being redeemed through the county tax collector's office was disclosed this week by the books of D. J. O'Leary, in charge of tax redemption. Collections for the fiscal year 1941-42, ending last June 30, totaled \$5,749,000, as compared with \$5,282,000 for the previous fiscal year. The increase, however, is credited to the "free ride" given the taxpayers last summer, when certain tax-delinquent property could be redeemed without payment of penalties or interest during July, August and September.
