

Better Get That Fed. Tax Stamp For Your Car

Warning was issued today by Nat. Rogan, collector of internal revenue for Southern California, that strict enforcement of the Motor Vehicle Use Tax law is planned by his office in the immediate future. Persons failing to purchase the \$5.00 Federal Auto Stamp will be subject to all penalties provided by the Act.

Conferences are now being held in Los Angeles to determine the exact date on which a survey will be made of all Southern California automobiles with a view to determining those cars which do not have the red auto stamp affixed.

Until August 1st the Motor Vehicle Stamp may be purchased at any Post Office in Southern California. After August 1st vehicle owners will be able to purchase these stamps only at the Revenue Offices in Los Angeles and San Diego.

Campaign Starts

General headquarters, in charge of the campaign to retain William G. Bonelli as member of the State Board of Equalization from the fourth district, has been opened in the Angeles Hotel, Fourth and Spring sts., Los Angeles, with other headquarters soon to be opened in all of the eight Southern counties in the Fourth district.

An intensive campaign to return Bonelli to the office which he now holds is planned by a large group of sponsors who appreciate the work Bonelli has done while a member of the State Board of Equalization.

William G. Bonelli has been a resident of Los Angeles since 1912. He is a lawyer, a rancher and a World War Veteran. He, at one time, served as an associate college professor and was president of the Los Angeles City Council from 1927 to 1929. Bonelli was appointed to the State Board of Equalization in 1938 and was elected in the primary in the elections of the same year by a majority of both Democratic and Republican voters.

The winner of Sunday's double-game engagement will play the winner of the Stockton-Sacramento series which is being held this Saturday and Sunday. The state title games is scheduled for Aug. 8 and 9, Riley said he would have more definite information as to the location of the championship tilt next week.

Other games scheduled during the coming evenings are: Tomorrow (Friday) night at 6:45 o'clock, a Torrance Soft Ball League contest between the Auxiliary Police and either a new team entry in the league or the Regular Police "Bombardiers". Other softball games, are scheduled next Monday, Thursday and Friday evenings.

On Saturday night, Aug. 1, Calship, winner of a 4 to 1 thriller Tuesday night over the 635th Tank Destroyers from March Field, will take on the all-pro club from Camp Cook, located at Santa Maria. All members of this service team are former professionals and semipro, it is reported.

Nearby Beaches Said Safe From Contamination

Beaches south of the Manhattan pier, including Hermosa, Redondo, Torrance and Palos Verdes were declared safe this week by the State Board of Health.

The board advised the Los Angeles city and county health departments to placard the beaches from the southern boundary of Santa Monica to the southern limits of El Porto because of sewage pollution. Such placards would warn the public that the northern beaches are dangerous because the sand and surf are contaminated with sewage from the outfall sewer at Hyperion.

A report of studies of beach pollution during July made by an investigator of the Board, states:

Sand Contains Grease
"The stretch of beach from the southern boundary of Santa Monica on the north to and including El Porto on the south shows consistently high sewage contamination of surf and sand. "The sand contains grease from the sewer. This makes it impossible to walk for any distance without stepping into sewage grease. Laboratory analyses of samples of surf water showed the water to be far above the safe limit of 10 sewage organisms per cubic centimeter of water. "Beaches north of Santa Monica pier were within the safe levels during July. Also safe were the southern beaches at Palos Verdes, Redondo, Hermosa and those south of the Manhattan pier."
