Madrid Right-of-Way Improvement Recommended by S. F. Engineer

In what residents of Madrid are always remember as a masterpiece of understatement—and when the proposed improvement is carried out—City Engineer Glenn M. Jain informed the city council Tuesday night that he had "received an encouraging report from the Santa Fe Railway regarding Madrid avenue."

At the same time, the city engineer reported that a Santa Fe crew has started improving the railroad crossing at Torrance blvd., and planned to relay the tracks there to conform with the city grade.

However, the improvement of the Madrid ave. right-of-way must await a crew. All available workers, Jain said he had been told, are now employed on a Santa Fe job near San Diego on a new spur line there. The railroad is importing Mexican and Indian workers from Oklahoma.

Mrs. Cecilia Young of 2355 Eldorado, voiced objection to the use of ice plants to cover the sides of the Madrid right-of-way and contended that Madrid itself should be widened and curbed. Ivy and tress or pointsettia plants and hedges, she told the council. Jain pointed out that a widening project probably would not get the approval of the War Production Board which has jurisdiction over such works.

Receiver Sought For Hollywood Riviera Club

Appointment of a receiver for the Hollywood Riviera Beach Club, part of whose property lies in Torrance, is demanded in a complaint on file today in Los Angeles county superior court, on behalf of Manuel Moss.

According to his complaint, Moss says he became an equal partner in the operation of the club last May 8, through a deal with Charles H. Goldman. However, he asserts that Goldman has exercised supervision of the affairs of the club, has discharged certain members of the staff who were selling memberships.

Moore also asks an accounting, dissolution of the partnership, and \$7500 in damages for alleged breach of agreement.
