Army Air Force Needs Men to Fight With Tools

You can fight with the tools you work with if you are mechanically-minded and want to join the Army Air Force.

Lieut. R. V. Wilkinson was in Torrance Tuesday reporting that a new recruiting station for Army Air Force ground crew maintenance men has been opened at 108 South Ocean Blvd., Long Beach. He said the Army was "in dire need of men with technical and mechanical ability to service the planes that are now being turned out in ever increasing number."

"Air crews are being trained as rapidly as the planes are coming off the assembly line but we're running into a 'bottle-neck' because the Army does not have enough men on the ground to keep the ships flying," he said.

There are no educational requirements to be met by men from 18 to 50 who can pass the physical tests and have an aptitude for working with their hands and tools. Recruits are trained to serve as ground crew maintenance units after eight weeks of basic Army "on the job training" at one of the many air centers.

Lieut. Wilkinson pointed out that opportunities for promotion and higher pay are exceptionally good because of the rapidly expanding Army Air Force. The recruiting office at 108 South Ocean Blvd., in Long Beach is open from 8 a. m. to 9 p. m.

News Ads Tell Story of Change In Packaging

News paper advertising was given credit today by a leading Pacific Coast food manufacturer for helping to solve a difficult problem by telling housewives in the quickest way possible about a packaging change arising out of wartime conditions.

Describing the difficult problem that resulted from the adoption of a new tight pack for Ruskets cereal, in response to the government's plea for more efficient packaging, L. V. Robertson, advertising manager of Loma Linda Food Co., pointed out that without the community newspaper it would have been next to impossible to secure the cooperation of housewives in such a short time for this conservation measure.

"When it was first decided to adopt a tight pack with 14 ounces of wheat flake biscuits in the same size package that usually contains only 7 or 8 ounces of flaked cereal, we knew we were tackling a difficult job," Robertson said. "Naturally we turned to the hometown newspapers as the quickest and most effective way to inform food buyers of this revolutionary change, by stressing in our copy the importance of buying by weight rather than size."

Ruskets, which are described as the cereal of many uses, were featured by Nancy Baker in the Cooking School conducted last week by the Torrance Herald and Lomita News.

County May Give Children Food

Provisions whereby any undernourished pupil in the schools of this community and the remainder of the county may receive free milk and lunches were made this week by the county department of public assistance, by order of the board of supervisors.

The following limitations have been set up by County Manager Alfred Campbell: First, County expenditures may be made only for children which the P. T. A. certifies to be in need and who are found to be members of active county relief cases, under the same general plan as in previous years.

Second, the county's participation in the program carried on by parochial schools and Parent-Teacher District No. 10 is to be limited to an average cost of \$2 a month for each child aided. Third, the county's participation in the program carried on by P.T.A. District No. 1 is to be limited to an average of \$3.14 for each child.
