County Civilian Defense Corps Has More Than 160,000 Enrolled

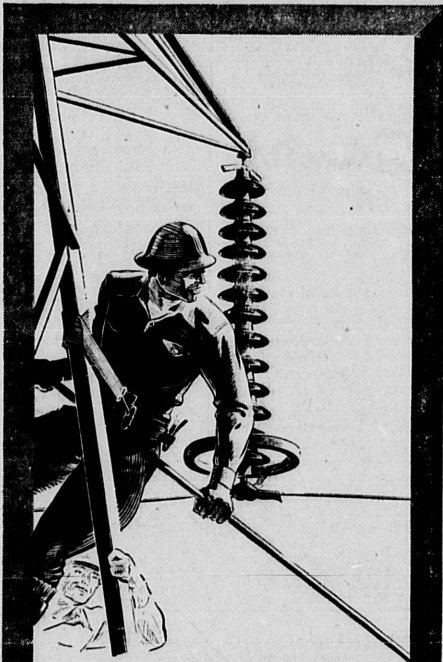
More than 4,600 air raid wardens in classes will be graduated during October, according to Harold W. Kennedy, executive director of the county defense council.
