Brush Blazes Probed by Arson Investigators

A fierce brush fire, which burned over about seven acres of the Chandler Sand and Gravel pits Monday night, was put out after more than an hour's fighting with water and shovels by the Lomita Fire Department. The Lomita department was called out at 10:45 p. m., and it was after midnight before the fire was under control. Grass is very high and dry in the hills this fall and the land lying south of the pits and some distance north of Palos Verdes Drive is mostly uncultivated. Any carelessly thrown match could start a fire. But the fact that three fires were burning, one on one side of the highway and two on the other, evidently starting about 200 feet apart, has led to an investigation by the arson squad of the sheriff's office. County authorities were outspoken in their belief that the Palos Verdes blaze and two others in the Malibu district may have been set as signal beacons. Deputy sheriffs said the fires flared simultaneously in the three locations and declared the blazes were incendiary. Keep 'em firing—with junk!

King Installed in Congress

Sworn in Oct. 13, Congressman Cecil R. King is now representing this 17th Congressional District in Washington. He was escorted to the well of the House for the induction ceremony by other California solons. Congressman King's new job for two years and three months had cost him \$4,590, according to his report on expenses incurred when he rode to election last August. King answered his first roll call by voting for the antipoll tax bill which the late Lee Geyer forced to the floor by a petition started just before he died. Fifteen other California delegates voted for the bill (HR1024) which would repeal the poll tax which some states levy. The House passed the bill 252 to 84.
