



Method Brush the cleaned, stuffed and trussed bird with shortening; place securely, breast up in a large flat pan. Prepare stilf dough, us-ing 6 to 8 cups of flour depending on the fowl's size. Add just enough write to form mixture that can be ang to be caps on nour depending on the fowl's size. Add just enough water to form mixture that can be rolled. Knead mixture well: roll out $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ inch thick and large enough to form a blanket that will drop clear down on either side of the bird. Place over bird (no tucking under, mind you). Be sure to let it hang free and be sure that it covers the bird! Pour 1 cup of water in pan: place immedi-ately in hor own ($\frac{450^\circ F}{100}$) for 15 minutes to allow blanket to set. This is absolutely necessary. And don't let the turkey stand with the dough blanket on. If blanket
