Lomita Boy's Death In Solomons Battle Confirmed by Navy

A hope that gained strength with every passing day last week that their son, Melvin Martin (George) Henderson, was safe and not a Navy battle casualty in the Solomons Islands, expired this morning in the hearts of Mr. and Mrs. Clyde N. Henderson of 25838 Cypress ave., Lomita. They received official announcement from the Navy Department of his death in action Nov. 15.

The Hendersons stoutly maintained until the arrival of the telegram from Washington, D. C., that George, who was 19 years of age and a sailor who loved the Navy, was a victim of mistaken identity. They were encouraged in this belief by reports from the American Red Cross that his name was not on any casualty list issued by the Navy up to and including Nov. 28.

The Hendersons received a letter on Nov. 23 from Capt. T. L. Gatch, U. S. N., which announced the young seaman had been killed in action in the South Pacific. A letter written by the boy on Nov. 9 and mailed on Nov. 11 was received on the same day as the communication from Capt. Gatch, Mrs. Henderson said. Another letter that was postmarked Nov. 12 was received by the parents from George, as he is familiarly known, who reported he was in fine condition.

Only an hour before the arrival of the official announcement, Mrs. Henderson had received a letter this morning from the clerk of the warship on which George served. This enclosed a form to fill out to obtain his pay and personal effects.

Bay Area, San Diego Navy Alert Cancelled After Pacific Patrol

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 3.—(By United Press special to The Herald)—A "Navy alert" which was sounded in San Francisco and San Diego last night and continued until a late hour this morning was cancelled when the "large force of unidentified surface craft proceeding toward the mainland" was found to be "friendly," according to an announcement by Rear Admiral J. W. Greenslade, commandant of Navy operations on the West Coast.

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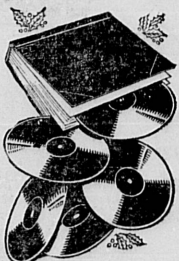
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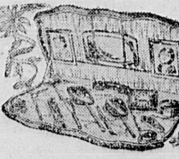
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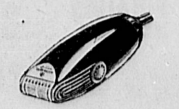


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
