'The experiences of the office of the Housing Coordinator indicate that there are many owners of private property in Torrance who would build under present restrictions if the technicalities involved in determining the type, quality and quantities of materials to be used were simplified. In order to effect this, I respectfully submit the following recommendations:

'First: That a reputable architect be commissioned to design sample floor plans for a model single family residence at two-family residence and multiple dwelling units and in each case to set up complete specifications and material lists; quantities to be indicated on sample Application Form PD 105 as furnished by the Federal Housing Administration, Priorities Division.


