Columbia Plant At Pittsburg Wins 'E' Award

With 113 production records to their credit since the United States entered the war, employees of Columbia Steel Co., Pittsburg Works, received their reward—the prized Army-Navy "E"—during colorful ceremonies at Pittsburg, Calif., last Saturday.

The much sought Army-Navy "E" award, which signifies high achievement in the production of vital war materials, was presented to employees by Admiral W. L. Friedell, commandant of the Mare Island Navy Yard. W. A. Ross, president of Columbia Steel Company, accepted the award in behalf of employees.

Participating in the program were high ranking Army, Navy, Marine and Coast Guard officers, the Camp Stoneman Band, a U. S. Marine Corps Color Guard, civic leaders and employees of Columbia Steel Company.

A feature of the program was the presentation of the first of individual "E" pins by Colonel K. B. Harmon, U. S. A., District Chief of the San Francisco Ordnance District, to Holger Jeppesen, a worker with one of the longest records of service with Columbia's Pittsburg Works. Jeppesen represented his fellow workers, all of who received "E" pins in recognition of their work. The entire program was broadcast by radio station KLX.

Columbia Steel workers in every department are making a splendid contribution to the war effort—not only in production but in the purchase of War Bonds and Stamps, it was disclosed yesterday with the latest report on such investments. Three departments are 100 per cent in support of the voluntary payroll savings plan. The are: Rolling Mill, Accounting and general superintendent's office employees. The Accounting department also has the highest percentage in War Bond and Stamp purchases out of their payroll dollars—13 per cent.

Each month finds a greater participation in the Bond sales. Fire District Hearing Set

A hearing will be held before the county board of supervisors Jan. 5 on the need for establishing an extension of the Willowbrook fire protection district to include the new synthetic rubber and aluminum plants. This will be the third hearing to be conducted on this issue of vital interest to all property owners in the county area near this city, according to Mrs. Ada Greene of 22412 South Normandie ave.

"We have the support of all property owners, including the Dominguez and Del Amo estates, but certain oil companies, which have their own fire protection service, are opposing the extension," she said this week. Three sub-stations are sought, the nearest one to Torrance being at 213th and Figueroa sts.
